# The Debt and Transfer Request Lists

This suggestion came up on the noticeboards, thanks to Craig Rathey who put it forward. As you should know, if you are more than £5 million overdrawn, you are not permitted to buy any players at all that turn – this includes loans – and are not allowed to agree any contracts. Whilst the financial affairs of clubs has always been kept confidential in League Soccer up until now, we were persuaded by Craig and others that it might be a good thing to list those clubs that were in debt. The big advantage of course is that it then anyone who was thinking of selling a player to that team will know that they can't do so – the deal would fail. Knowing that a club needs to sell players to carry on may also cause other managers to contact that team in an attempt to buy their players,

In another move to try to help facilitate more transfer dealings, we have also listed on the printouts those players who have asked for a transfer. These are not players whose managers have put them up for rale – rather the players who themselves currently want to leave their clubs (the ones with REQ by their contract details on the Squad Sheet). Note that the transfer request list is just for your information. These players do not necessarily have to be sold, they are just players who have asked for a transfer. Look out next week for a bigger feature on players and their transfer requests.

Would you believe it. How many wrong predictions can a person make in the same week. Last week I didn't think Chelsea would beat Barcelona – and they did. So what for the title now? Well I've tipped United all season long, even after they lost 6-1 I said they'll bounce back. They've got two easier games, as Mancini said, and if they win them both I still think Untied will be champions, I just can't see City going to St. James' Park and winning. Mind you, as Wigan showed at weekend, Newcastle really aren't all that good...

Chelsea were equally good in midweek against Barcelona. It looked very likely at one point that Barcelona would steamroller the Stamford Bridge side and had Messi slotted in his penalty, I think they probably would have done. But what about that. Great performance from Chelsea and Bayern Munich but what odds would you have got on all three of Kaka, Cristiano Ronaldo and Messi missing penalties over those two days. Incredible. Now if Chelsea can win the final, all that fighting over  $4^{\rm th}$  place will be academic anyway. Won't that be funny – Newcastle finish  $4^{\rm th}$  but don't get in the Champions League because Chelsea get the place instead! Those two play each other on Wednesday night of this week – an interesting one there.

This weekend also sees the FA Cup final. Call me a traditionalist, but I think this year the FA have been doing their best to kill the FA Cup. Or possibly the Premier League have been. But the FA need to put their foot down and make it special again. There shouldn't be other matches on the same day as the semi finals, it detracts totally from them. I know now they are at Wembley that would mean a whole weekend off but so what. That's how it should be. And as for the final, well that's just crazy. Kick off at quarter past five in the evening. I suppose it's slightly better than last year when United were winning the league whilst City and Stoke kicked off in the cup final - and Sky Sports just pretended there was no cup final going on. Predictions for that. Chelsea to beat Newcastle in midweek, then lose surprisingly to Liverpool 2-1 in the FA Cup final and by the same scoreline to Bayern Munich in the Champions League Final. Defeat to Chelsea will be followed by a draw to Man City for Newcastle and they won't make it into the Champions League. Chelsea will draw with Liverpool next Tuesday and beat Blackburn to get 4<sup>th</sup> place - Spurs will lose to Bolton but beat Villa and Fulham to miss out on goal difference. City will beat QPR but United will narrowly defeat Sunderland to win the league. At the bottom, Bolton will beat Tottenham and West Brom to stay up, Wigan will beat Wolves on the last day of the season. QPR will beat Stoke but lose at City to go down so even if Aston Villa will lose to Spurs and Norwich they will stay up on goal difference.
